



Course

Language Arts 10-12

*Language arts is a multi-faceted course which covers numerous topics. In Language Arts 10/12, students in this upper-level writing course will read, critique, and compose original poetry, essays, short fiction, and creative non-fiction. Students will examine the works of published writers as well as peers to discover, expand, and refine their own skills, voice, and repertoire. In addition, students will study Greek and Latin roots and key words derived from these roots in order to increase their vocabulary knowledge and usage. Also, reading poetry and short stories in their literature book and novels will expose them to numerous authors and styles of writing from a Christian perspective. These pieces will include lessons on local color, dialect, irony, satire, and imagery. Finally, writing about literature will be incorporated through analysis and response, and students will complete a research paper as well. *NOTE: This class alternates Creative Writing I with Creative Writing II and American Literature with English Literature, so this class may be taken 2 years in a row without repeating content.*
